#### EDITORIAL

Since I last wrote there has been a dramatic increase in petrol prices. It seems to me that the oil companies have taken advantage of their strenght by cutting back supplies by fifteen percent and then increasing the price by the same amount so that their income doesn't suffer. The motorist loses out in both directions - there are now occasional difficulties in getting the stuff, particularly at weekends, and then he has to pay a high price for it.

Once again we are all looking for ways of making our cars use less petrol. If the situation doesn't improve no doubt we'll be given some 'help' by the Government. During the last petrol crisis we were given the blanket 50mph speed limit which was difficult to enforce and the results were doubtful. In an effort to postpone the re-introduction of such a restriction I feel sure that if the current speed limits were enforced more rigorously this would give some saving and make our roads somewhat safer. Cruise at 70mph on a motorway and quite often you can be the slowest vehicle. The disregard that many have for the 30mph limit in built-up areas is flagrantly dangerous. Drivers like the guy who recently passed me at over 70mph in a car which was towing a boatought to be convicted and have their heads examined.

For example, I went to Cairo recently which in itself was interesting for Ford has been excluded from Egypt for about 20 years and we took a tractor to the Cairo International Trade Fair and aroused quite considerable interest. In spite of the fact that Ford have not been able to bring any cars in I saw an E493A and an E494A. also several 100E's, a couple of 105E's and a few others too. I got a slide of the Anglia but it looks pretty sorry for itself, although I guess that the car is still going speaks highly for it. 
The competition was won by Roger Johnson with the only

Apart from the nonstandard paint job and a few extra lights, this car is still much the same as when it was new and Mr. Ali has had a number of offers from people who would like to buy it as a collector's item.

In contrast (bottom picture), this was a variation on the Range Rover theme which I saw at the Geneva Show. Produced by Carmichael of Worcester in England, who make six-wheeled Range Rovers for a variety of uses, this particularly attractive example
