I TIONAL MOTOR MUSEUM LIBRARY

As readers will have gathered from other articles the spares are now being split up among different assistant spares secretaries. This was mainly because they were beginning to crowd Willy and Sue out of their home. I have now taken over the smaller parts for the 'Y' model 1932-7. If you read the 'Y' sparss availability list carefully you will find that some things are a real bargain. Most of these spares were bought some time ago, and since we need some cash to buy more we are letting them go cheap to Club members. Note also that they are carriage paid prices, so if you like to ring me on Dartford 21769 you may be able to arrange to collect at the Club stall at various autojumbles at a discount. This particularly applies to heavy bits like shackles.

People often ask whether the Club has a workshop manual for the 'Y' but in fact manuals as such did not start till some time after 1937. Ford did, however, issue bulletins as and when required, and these were numbered. They contained various modifications with full instructions and illustrations and a complete set would be almost equal to a manual. We are now trying to fine a complete set and if we do they will be reprinted and offered to members. If you have a complete set and are willing to loan them for copying I would be delighted to hear from you.

Some spares are still available from dealers, TRE's gasket sets, brake linings, tyres and tubes, bulb batteries, plugs and fan-belts should be easy enough for members who live in cities to dig up. However, some of these will dry up soon, so we propose to get in a stock of some items, direct from the manufacturers where possible, so that the Club can be sure of keeping its members on the road when other stocks finally run out. If you know of any garage which has a stock of 'out of date' spares why not chat them up? If you tell them that you want them for the Ford SV Club (we can supply you with a letter confirming that you are a genuine Club member acting on the Club's behalf) you may be plea-

sntly surprised. One of our members, Trevor Odell of Hertford did just that and came away with van-loads of stuff at knockdown prices (including some 'Y' spares). Nice one, Trevor!, and of course, our grateful thanks to J.R. Ford & Sons.

I am now putting together a list of spares that members urgently need, and another list of spares that members feel the club ought to stockpile. Do write or phone and let me know what you need. The big trouble of course is money. I have lately been asking 'Y' members how they feel about a 'Y' spares levy specially to try and grab the last of these spares (I have heard of stuff being thrown a 'y or being sent back to Ford for scrapping). Would you be willing to pay a levy? How much? Should those who have paid in have a discount? What else would you like to see the Club do for 'Y' members? If you want to get the most out of your membership then inundate me with a flood of suggestions, hints, articles, offers of help etc!
